REPORT ON THE UNESCO WORLD LOGIC DAY 2021 IN NIGERIA

The UNESCO World Logic Day Nigeria was organized with the theme *Logic- A World of Interdisciplinary Science*.

The event took place on the 14th of January, 2021 via a zoom meeting, featuring talks from different presenters. The meeting started at 11.00am (GMT+1), with a short note on the background of the *World Logic Day*, and lasted for about two hours. Four speakers with different backgrounds, but working with logic, made presentations on the implications of logic across different areas of research.

The event had eighty-one (81) registered participants from different parts of the world.
